## Compromised Thinking

1 Kings 17
1 of 5

1 Kings 16:29-33

When our faith in God is compromised, our thinking can also become compromised.

Compromised thinking: If God loved us, we would not experience pain.

Right thinking: Despite faithfulness to God, we experience the painful consequences of sin, ours and others.

1 Kings 17:1

Compromised thinking: Faithfulness to God means not experiencing hardship.

Right thinking: God will provide sustenance for those who serve Him and that blessing spreads to others.

1 Kings 17:2-6
1 Kings 17:7-9

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Compromised thinking: If God loved me, He would simply give me what I needed.

Right thinking: Faith is sometimes required before we see God demonstrate His provision or blessing.

1 Kings 17:10-12
1 Kings 17:13-16

Compromised thinking: Tragic events are punishment or a sign of God's disregard for us.

Right thinking: We do not know why God allows tragedy, but difficulty is meant to develop faith and maturity.
